

October Worship: Reformation Month

Reformation Day is October 31, so Reformation Sunday is always the last Sunday of the October. This year, happily, it actually falls on the 31st.

October begins as well as ends with Reformation: Saturday October 2 is our splendid parish Reformation Faire. (As I write this, a couple weeks in advance, I keep being delight by the preparations I see: the great door Rollie Ode made, Craig's amazing menu, Chris Bliesner's wonderfully creative costuming, etc.)

There are so many great and important Lutheran insights into the truth of God. While they are in the background of all our preaching and worship, sometimes it is good to focus on them, in order to explore and learn them in detail, so that we can be more mature and wise Christians. Maybe we can all this October, "Lutheranism 101."

Sunday October 3. THE CHURCH. Luther, and the Augsburg Confession, defined "The church" differently than the pope did. So, what is the Church? Also, Luther DID NOT leave the church to start a new one; why is that important? After 500 years of division, and 100 years of ecumenism, are we justified in having a separate church?

Sunday October 10. Martin Luther will be here to preach! His sermon will be "The Experience of the Gospel: Mine and Yours." It is also blanket Sunday at MM.

Sunday October 17. TWO KINGDOMS. God rules the world two ways: through the Church, Word, Sacraments and Holy Spirit God makes people good so that they do what is beneficial. On the other hand, God also establishes secular powers (such as parents and governments) to reward good and punish evil and regulate life. How are the two related, and what do they owe each other? And how do we live subject to both reigns of God? (MM: Open forum on suggestion to change worship schedule)

Sunday October 24. LAW AND GOSPEL
Perhaps the most helpful of Lutheran insights.

God's Law demands righteousness. It shows our sin and God's anger at our wrong-doing. God's Gospel *gives* righteousness. It shows our Savior and God's grace to believers.

Sunday October 31 Reformation Sunday (You may wish to wear red.) THE key issue of the Reformation was: *What justifies a sinner* so that he or she may live with God. The pope's answer: good works. Luther's answer: *faith alone, without works of the law.*

The Eucharist will be celebrated on Oct 3, 17 and 31.

Since it is Reformation month, and since Luther wrote so many fine hymns, many of which we do not know, we will learn a new one of his, a communion hymn, to sing on the 31st. LBW #215, "O Lord We Praise You."

REFORMATION FAIRE!

On the beautiful grounds of Mt. Morris Lutheran Church—between the hilly meadow and the oak woods—the Reformation Faire will take place.

Saturday, Oct. 2, 10 AM – 2 PM.

Much of it outdoors, but much indoors. Even if there is rain, there will be plenty to do.

First, there will be a Wittenberg door! The Reformation of the Church really got going when the monk, Martin Luther, used the church door (which was a university bulletin board) to propose debate about the reality of forgiveness and indulgences as practiced by the Roman church. Children--and adults!—will have the chance to nail (actually, thumbtack) their own theses (statements) to the door about how Christ is the Savior.

There will be lots of great food! Some of it from the early 1500's, nearly all of it German. The menu will include

- + BRAUERE SCHENKE (Beer Marinated pulled pork) served on an Old World Rye bun with Caraway/Raisin/Apple Sauerkraut;
- + KNOCKWURST;
- + BIER GARTEN PIZZA Glazed onion Apple & Bratwurst with cheese;
- + Pretzels, popcorn, and dessert and more

There will be story-tellers! Many people who knew Martin Luther will be there to tell stories about him: his dramatic, death-defying stance for truth, the fun of marrying him, what he was like as a child, a staged kidnapping, his exciting teaching. They will be in costume: his mother, his wife, his duke, his confessor, his best friend, one of his students, etc. The story-tellers will be scattered about the grounds, sitting or walking around, looking for people to tell their stories to.

There will be several games for children. Games from the time, that Luther himself may have played. Children can also get a "Reformation Passport." If they visit enough (different for different ages) activities they get a reward.

Inside the church some brief lectures will be given. **“Reformation Music”** will explain how the music used in worship was changing from monks chanting to the congregation singing hymns, and will explain the special characteristics of hymns of the time, including the form called “Lutheran Chorale.” **“Reformation Theology”** will explain the key theological issues at stake: what were the most important points of disagreement. **“Reformation Worship”** will explain the changes that happened in the worship service and practice of the sacraments. Each lecture will be 15-20 minutes, and will be offered twice.

Adult Confirmation

Two points.

1. To be a Christian requires one to “Stand up, stand up for Jesus.” Normally, as in the Acts of the Apostles, this occurs at Baptism. In requesting the baptismal grace of Jesus Christ, a person is confessing their sin and their faith in the Savior. “Here I stand!” For those baptized in infancy, the Church has since ancient times provided the ceremony of confirmation for the already-baptized to *stand and confess*.

Confirmation is thus hugely important. It is like enlisting in the Marines, becoming a US citizen or

getting married. It is dedicating one's life to another person or group of people. A Marine is always a Marine. A wife is always a wife.

To make any of these commitments, takes preparation. Only a fool would make such a huge commitment without knowing what it is all about! This is why pre-confirmation instruction is so very important. One needs to know what Christians believe and how they live. One needs to love the Church's faith and way of life enough *to swear to God* that he will do it. One is marrying Jesus Christ, marrying his Church.

Anyone who seriously wants to belong to Jesus Christ will do these things.

2. Therefore, for adults in our churches who are not yet confirmed, I offer the following opportunities. We will enjoy learning God's Word, and discussing together, and growing in faith. Classes will be on the following Thursdays:

Catechetics
(Instruction for Confirmation)

Holden Lutheran Parish

The following plan has been proposed by Pastor, in consultation over the years with parents, and adopted by both church councils.

It is difficult to construct a good plan for confirmation instruction, because there are many factors to be considered:

- + We must provide adequate instruction for a lifetime of Christian living (most church members take no formal instruction later);
- + Some parents do not themselves know, and therefore have not taught their children, that the Kingdom is the "treasure in the field, for which a man joyfully sells all he has,"--that is, that Christ is the best thing in life;
- + Youth have busy lives;
- + Limitations on Pastor's time.

After discussion with many and careful thought, it seems that the following compromise is a good one at this time. These are its advantages:

- + It builds on past and present practice (instruction continued into 9th grade in 2009 and 2010)

- + It extends instruction—and steady connection with the Church—into 9th grade, the beginning of high school when youth especially need their church connection;
- + It equals two school years (18 months) of instruction;
- + It keeps 7th and 8th graders together, and lets 9th graders be separate for more advanced instruction;
- + It uses the freedom that middle schools provide after school on Wednesdays, and high schools on Wednesday evenings.

The Plan

There are three segments of instruction.

1. A Bible overview.
2. Catechism I (Commandments, Creed)
3. Catechism II (Baptism, Lord's Supper, Lord's Prayer) and "Christian life topics" (Stewardship, Evangelism, Worship, and special Lutheran insights).

7th and 8th graders will meet together, September through March (7 mos.). Bible overview begins in the fall of even-numbered years, and Catechism I in odd-numbered.

9th grade will be spent in Catechism II, meeting twice a month, Sept-Feb. This year will also include a mentor program and will probably conclude with a retreat a few weeks prior to the confirmation service to help prepare them spiritually for a life of Christian faith and life.
